My Dear Bishop

I did not receive your letter in time to meet you yesterday at the Book Room. This morning I called at the Waldorf & the Clerk said you had gone - I noted they had several letters for you but probably you have ordered them forwarded to you -

I saw Mr. Andrews again to-day. I told him you had written me that you were encouraged with what I had said to you regarding him & the letter - he was taken off. He said he was glad to hear it - I then talked with him about paying the \$2500 he had subscribed some time ago - and told him it would be very useful to us just now if he could make it convenient to pay it

He told me if I would come in on Tuesday
weet he would pray it - I told him things
were brightening up with us & that the future
was full of promise - I have no question but
he will continue to work with us. I did not
ask him for any pledges to continue to serve as
Prest of the Board - That was not necessary after
what he had said & it was best to assume
that that was all settled -

I go to Wilmington Del to-morrow
to preach Sunday & expect to call upon Judge
Love & Judge Gray & others there on Monday -
Then return Monday night & see Mr. Andrews
Tuesday morning - If you desire me to
come to Washington later in the week to meet
Bishop McCabe let me know - If he is likely
to be in New York however soon I can meet
him or you there -
