I suppose you & Bishop McCabe will have started in Canton before this reaches Washington, if so he will have told you of our interview with Pierpont Morgan - He has promised us to look into the matter & I gave him the chart of the building the address delivered at the corner stone laying & Bishop McCabe's appeal - I do hope he will do something for us - I intend to keep in touch with him —

I went to see about the Stickney matter, saw Dr Willey this week - He says Mr. Willey will positively pay the \$1000 sometime within the year from the time of Mr. Stickney's death

The only other encouraging feature I met
with this week was a promise from Mr.
Pearsall of Redgewood to help us after
a while - He is just now at the head
of a movement to bring up our Veterans
Minister's Redwood Fund to a hundred
Thousand dollars & is giving ~~it~~^{liberally}
to that he sent me a thousand dollars
check' in that last Conference & as
you may know this year he said "After
I get through with this matter I will
see what I can spare for the Ministry -

Next week I am going to try it
in New England again - I shall
probably call on Mr. Wesson & tell him
what we are doing but in view of
the contemplated visit to him by
Brulps McCabe & Mallalieu I shall
not ask him for anything - I do not
wish to interfere with their plans -
But as I expect to be in Springfield, it will
be best for me not to neglect seeing him -
