My Dear Dr. Davidson

Box 156, Ocean Grove
(Early June, 1904)

We closed up the Conference at Monday morn
on the Saturday after you left - At the evening session
very nice resolutions were passed unanimously with
regard to the University - I did not get the last
issue of the daily as we left on Monday too early
to get it, but I have no doubt you have or will
see it - I did not get to Catalina Island,
I was sorry, after your description but did not
think it best to tire ourselves with going
out of our way in any direction - We came down
direct the way our tickets read making brief
stops at Palo Alto, San Francisco, Salt Lake City,
Mandan, Denver & St Louis, where we stopped
three days at the fair - At Palo Alto I
called upon Mrs Leland Stanford, Mrs G. S.

spent the afternoon there, after thoroughly inspecting the University, Mr Stanford personally came to the carriage in which my wife was awaiting me & invited her to the dinner we spent an hour with her - I had difficulty to get away & did let me train go she made us so welcome - I had a fine opportunity to tell her all about what we are trying to do at Washington & she told us all about her plans at Palo Alto - I felt the importance of handling the Case with great delicacy, lest I should spoil a good chance to have her take an interest in us & I did not want her to think that I had made a special journey after money from her, she did say however, without my asking her, & emphatically intimate that help at this juncture in the affairs of the General Conference (she said she had read of the Conference action) would be very far reaching in its influence & may help our Church & the Country & that we needed a million or two just now to give us a start - She said "She had personally given thirteen millions to their university & it had cost the state some twenty-five millions & that she had turned over the entire tithe to the trustees & was living on her income so that she
