



My Dear Dr Davidson

Ocean Grove N.J.
Sept 20th 1901

I had a nice talk with Mr J Prescott Morgan yesterday, which simply resulted in a repetition of what he told me before. He said he had the matter under careful consideration but he had not yet finished up the other educational matters he told me about & he wanted to do that before he took up mine. He said "I told you before that as soon as I got ready I would send to you & it is my purpose to do so" I reminded him that that was over a year ago & that I might the present interview in fear that it might have escaped his attention. He said "Not so I have it in mind and have all your papers at hand & I shall send to you when I get ready" - I told him what we were doing

Hoping that he might give me a hint - as to
the time, but to all appeals, he made the same
reply. My belief that he intends to do a big
thing for us when he gets ready is confirmed
by this interview. He surely would not put me
off so many times on a small donation. This
time he could have avoided the interview if he
had so desired because I wrote to him asking
the interview & stating why I wanted it. I
sent the letter to him through his Secretary. After
reading it he sent for me & gave me full
opportunity to state the case with the above
result -
