#### Fall Farmers Markets

We all want fresh food but when some fruits and veggies are technically available all year-round in the arocery store, it's hard to know what's "in season" and what isn't. Here is a brief unofficial guide on what to look for at local farmers markets in the fall months as fresh, delicious, and at their peak "vum" time:

- Winter Squash (October-December)
- Concord Grapes (October)







- Pomegranates (September-January)
- Apples (Good now: Gala, Jonagolds and Honeycrips; Late October: Granny Smith)
- Brussels Sprouts (October-February)
- Egaplant (Actually a berry and hitting its peak RIGHT NOW due to an unusually warm fall season)
- Sweet Potatoes (November-December)
